When can my child return to school?

Symptoms

Fever Red, itchy rash on the body. Changes from bumps to blisters to scabs.

Runny nose, scratchy throat, cough.

Fever or chills, cough, shortness of breath, fatigue, body aches, headache, sore throat, loss of taste or smell.

Temperature over 100 Degrees.

Fever, chills, cold symptoms, body aches, sometimes vomiting, and diarrhea.

Red, oozing, blister-like rash.

Ear pain, fever.

Watery, itchy eyes. Redness in the white of eyes, puffy eyelids, drainage from eyes, crusty. Discomfort.

Skin - pink, raised patches and mild itching. Scalp - flaky or crusty patches and hair loss.

When to return to school

Not until all the bumps have scabs and no new bumps appear for 2 days.

Your child may go to school with minor cold symptoms.

Stay home for at least 5 days from the time your symptoms begin. If no symptoms, stay home for at least 5 days from the day of your + test.

Stay home until there is no fever for 24 hours without using fever-reducing medication.

Stay home until there is no fever for 24 hours without using fever-reducing medications and symptoms improve.

Cover all involved areas until completely healed. Avoid close contact activities until all lesions are scabbed over.

Your child may attend school if comfort level allows.

Your child may return to school as advised by your child's medical provider.

Treat as advised by your child's medical provider. Skin - keep covered. Scalp- don't share hats, brushes or clothing.

Depends on the cause

Symptoms

Itching and scratching. Scabies affects the skin; lice affect the scalp.

Sore throat, fever, headache, stomachache.

Vomits more than one time Loose, runny stools.

When to return to school

For scabies - keep your child home until treatment is started. For lice - check your child's head for 10 days. Re-treat as needed.

Keep your child home until there is no fever and has received antibiotics for 24 hours (if prescribed).

Keep your child home until there has been no vomiting or diarrhea for 24 hours.

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
